### APPLICATION FOR WATER CONNECTION TO THE CITY OF ESCALANTE

I hereby apply to the City of Escalante for permission to connect my premises located at \_\_\_\_\_ with the City's water system, and agree as follows:

1. The City shall make the requested connection from its main to and including the water meter at my property line.
2. I agree to pay the City a \$1,500.00 connection charge, and any other fees as may be fixed by the City for inspection, investigation, impact fees or other costs caused by said connection. This charge is for a meter installed along an existing main line.
3. The location of the meter will be decided solely by the City.
4. Plumbing on my premises may be inspected by the City and if not approved I will cause it to be rectified at my own expense, to meet the plumbing codes of this City or any other agency having jurisdiction.
5. I will be bound by the rules, regulations, resolutions and ordinances now or hereafter enacted by said City.
6. The purpose of the water connection is \_\_\_\_\_
7. The Connection so made by the City, including the meter, shall remain the property of the City, and the City shall have free access thereto at all reasonable times, through my property if necessary.
8. The City shall approve applications for new water connections only when such a request is accompanied by an approved municipal project approval form for which city water is required. The project must be started within a year of approval or the water connection will go back to the city. Any and all fees paid are non-refundable.

## SUMMARY OF ESCALANTE CITY REQUIREMENTS FOR NEW WATER METER CONNECTIONS

1. Water meters must be installed on public right of way adjoining the property to be served. The consumers pipeline may not cross land the consumer does not own.
2. Water meters and the pipelines feeding meters are the property of the City and may not be tampered with for any reason. The consumers pipes and maintenance responsibility shall begin at the outflow side of their meter. The consumer must install a valve at that point to control the water flow on their property.
3. The standard connection fee pays for the City to install a  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch meter and up to 100 feet of service pipeline to supply the meter. The consumer must pay all additional installation and repair cost for meters larger than  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch.
4. If new meters are over 250 feet from an existing water main, the consumer must pay the full cost for the City to extend the main line and install fire hydrants. All line extensions must meet the City construction standards.
5. All requests for water meters must have City Council approval. The City Council may limit the number of connections. Meters will be installed at the time all water fees are paid.
6. After the installation of the water meter, no water connection shall be moved or transferred from any property to any other property. Meters may be moved at the expense of the consumer only on the property they serve.
7. The project for the requested meter must be started within a year of approval or the water connection will go back to the city. Any and all fees paid are non-refundable.
8. 8. The city shall approve applications for new water connections only when such a request is accompanied by an approved municipal project approval form for which city water is required. Upon approval, applicant shall have 60 days to obtain a Garfield County Building Permit and pay all fees or applicant will have to reapply for the water connection. The project must be started within a year of approval and have an active County Building Permit or the water connection will go back to the city. Any and all fees paid are non-refundable.
